- Make certain health and safety principles are an essential part of management and decisionmaking process.
- Create an atmosphere that motivates and supports all employees and stakeholders in their efforts to achieve an injury and incident free working environment.
- Provide appropriate training and assessment to all employees to ensure that the organisation's objectives are continually met.
- Recognise, acknowledge and promote excellent safety performance.
- Ensure each individual accepts personal responsibility and accountability for their own safety and that of their workmates.
- Audit operation and business processes regularly to access performance and compliance to the Safety Management System.
- Eliminate unsatisfactory behaviour and conditions in the workplace.
- Engage in open and transparent communication with stakeholders to achieve a greater understanding of the Safety Management System and Practices.
- Consider and establish appropriate health and safety requirements when selecting business partners and contractors.
- Comply with legal requirements and international standards with the objective to perform beyond regulatory standards.
- Establish and review measurable safety objectives and targets
